

Application form for a Discretionary Housing Payment

A Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP) may be awarded when the City of London considers that a claimant requires further financial assistance towards their rent costs.

You must be in receipt of either Housing Benefit (HB) or the housing element of Universal Credit (UC). (Please note that while the housing costs element of the UC award notification may refer to support for mortgage interest payments, owner-occupiers are not eligible to receive DHPs).

You have indicated that you are interested in applying for a Discretionary Housing Payment. We require certain information and evidence from you in order that your claim can be considered.

Privacy notice

This privacy notice explains how the City of London will use any personal information we collect about you when you apply for a Discretionary Housing Payment

What personal data is collected about you

We collect details about you, people in your household or joint tenants. This specifically includes your and possibly your household members' names, address, contact details including telephone number and email address, dates of birth, National Insurance Numbers, incomes - including earnings, self-employed accounts, benefits received/claimed, loans, student income, pensions, expenditure (such as child care costs), - capital including bank/building society accounts, shares and rent details.

What special category data is collected about you

We also collect what's known as "special category data", which may include nationality, gender and disability status

Reasons why we use your personal data

We use your data to assess your entitlement to a Discretionary Housing Payment. This information is only used for the intended purpose but if we intend to use it for any other purpose; we will normally ask you first. The City of London may also use your information for another purpose if it has a legal duty to do so such as to prevent and detect fraud or if there is a risk of serious harm or threat to life.

Why we are allowed to use your personal data

We can use the personal data we collect about you because we have your consent, and, in some circumstances, we have a legal obligation.

Who we can share your personal data with

The information we collect may be shared with the following:

- You
- Council staff employed to administer Discretionary Housing Payments
- Other Council Services
- Department for Work and Pensions (DWP)

Information will usually only be shared to enable quick and accurate assessment of any Discretionary Housing Payment award.

How long we keep your personal data for

Information will be held for up to 6 years following the closure of a claim.

Situations when your personal data might be sent to other countries

Personal data that we collect about you will not be shared outside the United Kingdom
